For more than 100 years, Roth's landscape paintings and etchings of his architectural drawings have been exhibited in museums and galleries worldwide. His works are held in many notable collections, including the Art Institute of Chicago, The New York Public Library, the Museum of Fine Arts Boston, the National Gallery of Art, the Uffizi Gallery (Florence), and the Victoria and Albert Museum (London). | <p>James Forman and The National Black Economic Development Conference's "Black Manifesto" and related documents, 1969-1972.</p> <p>On Sunday, May 4, 1969 James Forman interrupted worship at Riverside to present the "Black Manifesto" for reparations from the "white Christian churches and synagogues in the United States." Newspaper reports note that copies of the manifesto were handed out to church members prior to the interruption. On July 13, 1969, Rev.
